MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Dear Lifesaving Friend,

I'm often asked, "Why are there so many dogs entering the city shelter in San Antonio?" The truth is, there are multiple reasons the number of cats and dogs entering our city shelter is increasing. Nearly 20% of San Antonio residents live in poverty. In some areas it is common for homeowners to leave their pets outside with little to no containment. For those who rent, breed and size restrictions are typically present. Additionally, San Antonio residents often struggle to find access to affordable vet care which leads to there being a large number of pets not being spayed and neutered. All of this combined made 2023 a very challenging year for large dogs across the country and in San Antonio.

Moving forward, SAPA! is looking inward to refine its lifesaving strategies and capacity. Our team is thinking outside of the box and creating a path to increase our impact. The first step we have taken is realigning our team and investing more resources in our foster program. One thing SAPA! knows for certain is that fostering is effective at lifesaving. In 2023, SAPA! had more than 1,400 people open their homes and care for the animals in our custody by being a volunteer foster. By doubling our foster employees, we optimistically anticipate our investment in the foster program will expand our reach in the community, encourage new fosters to join the cause, and ultimately create a positive impact for homeless animals in San Antonio.

In addition to growing our foster program, we launched a capital campaign to build San Antonio Pets Alive! a permanent shelter – one that will create a calm, compelling, natural environment, allowing for animals to thrive and find their forever family in surroundings that encourage adoption and fostering.

We are committed to our mission of saving the lives of the most vulnerable animals. With support from our community, SAPA! is striving to save 5,000 lives in 2024.

Pacifica's Story

Pacifica arrived at the SAPA! Medical Clinic after a heart-wrenching incident where she was thrown from a car onto the highway. Pacifica's entire back left side was completely burned off. Upon her examination, we learned that Pacifica was also pregnant.

Pacifica gave birth to her kittens in a loving foster home. Pacifica was later adopted from the Petco Love Adoption Center!

Our Rescue Center

We rescue the most at-risk animals and focus on saving last-chance animals. We are the only High-Volume Pet Partner for San Antonio's Animal Care Services and the City provides us with valuable space to support their lifesaving. This building is vital to our life-saving mission because it allows us access to quickly save animals on their euthanasia list and bring them into our care, at our Rescue Center.

This Rescue Center was specifically built for puppies, and because of this, our order of rescue priority is puppies and kittens, cats, small dogs, then medium dogs, to rescuing large dogs. Until we have a facility of our own, we must keep this model as the kennels aren't big enough for large dogs to be housed comfortably.

We are what's considered a High-Volume Pet Partner (HVPP) of the city shelter, meaning that we rescue A LOT of animals from them. As soon as we rescue them, they get examined and treated at our rescue center, move into a foster home or to our Medical Care Center if they have medical needs. Sometimes they stay at our rescue center until they are adopted.





Saving Our Neonates!

Many of the animals on the city shelter euthanasia list are vulnerable neonatal puppies and kittens who need roundthe-clock care. Our life-saving initiative fills a crucial gap, creating a lasting impact in the lives of neonatal kittens and puppies who are most often overlooked and underserved.

Snowpea's Happy Ending

Snowpea entered the city shelter in September 2023. Her intake notes indicated that she was covered in fleas, stickers, dirt and appeared to have an upper respiratory infection.

Snowpea spent some time in a loving foster home and is now enjoying life with her forever family.







Adoption

SAPA! focuses on encouraging adoption over buying pets from breeders and raises awareness that by adopting, two lives are saved by making room for another at-risk pet. We communicate to our adopters about animal behaviors, proper care, and the importance of spay and neuter to eliminate unwanted litters.

Magenta's Life-Saving Story

Magenta was saved from the City Shelter's euthanasia list. When she was rescued, she was emaciated and had open wounds up and down one of her legs. Despite her painful conditions, Magenta's sweet and loving personality never faded. Unfortunately, it was deemed necessary to amputate her leg.

After emergency surgery and a long recovery, Magenta starred in a Snuggle Session where she was ultimately adopted. Magenta was transported out of state and now lives with her forever family in Colorado!



Fostering

This year we set a SAPA! record by having more than 1,400 foster families enrolled in the foster program. A foster family provides a temporary living situation for dogs and cats in our care while they are awaiting adoption. Fosters provide shelter, care, and love to animals in need and SAPA! provides all medical treatments, vaccines, microchips, and marketing support.









Tovi's Hero

Tovi was surrendered to San Antonio's City Shelter after it appeared he was attacked by a group of dogs. It was discovered that Tovi sustained an injury to one of his front legs and one ear. Tovi recovered from his injuries in a foster home. Later, Tovi's foster received an adoption application from Mr. Tovar, the man who originally rescued the kitten while he was being attacked. Mr. Tovar visited sweet Tovi at our Petco Love Adoption Center, completed the adoption paperwork, and took him home!
